Our lessons are interactive, focused, and with an emphasis on communication. Due to the small size of the classes, teachers can personalise the lessons to suit your individual needs.

In the first hour we focus on **Practical English** and **Study Skills**. These classes will help students become confident and fluent speakers by providing the key phrases and conversational tools they need to get their message across. Students will hear real conversation examples and learn how to choose the right words, pronunciation and tone. The students will also get tips and practice techniques on how to become more efficient learners of languages.

For the next two hours we work with a course book which provides a good balance of grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and skills. The topics are engaging and varied tasks and activities get students talking on every page.

In the afternoon we offer topic based classes. Each week will have an overall theme, students will focus on further practising their language skills. The students might have educational visits and do further research on the topics that catch their attention and will prepare well organised, creative and confident presentations.

Teachers can personalise the classes to suit your individual needs.

Students will have homework most nights and a test at the end of each week so they can monitor their progress. Long term students have progress tests, tutorials and progress reports every 6 weeks. At the end of the course, students receive a certificate stating their level according to the Common European Framework.

ENGLISH FOR JUNIORS AND TEENS

(AGE 14-17)

Beginning at 9:00 a.m., you will have two 2 General English lessons in a group of no more than 14 students.

The first 90 minute lesson will provide a good balance of grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and skills. The topics are engaging and varied tasks and activities get students talking on every page.

The second 90 minute lesson focuses on 21st century skills. Students will take part in project work which will include team work, critical thinking and problem solving activities, study skills and presentation skills on a number of topics that interest teenagers.

In the afternoon most students join our social activities for an enjoyable local outing, such as visiting the Oxford Castle, games and picnics in the park, and ice skating. Social activities generally run from 1:30pm and are finished by 4:00pm.

Our specially selected teachers make learning English fun and exciting.

Juniors aged 10 to 13 start their day with cultural and social activities and enjoy using their English in a more relaxed environment.

After lunch they have two daily classes. The first 90 minute lesson starting at 1pm will focus on grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and skills. In the second lesson, students will be

doing project work and practising drama skills while preparing weekly presentations and performances to boost their confidence and creativity.



This normally needs to be done one month before the exam and costs, on average, £200 for the test. Please note in the summer the exam gets booked up quickly. Please talk to a member of staff to check the dates of the exam.

WINTER PROGRAMME (CLIL)

The Winter Programme is a truly unique course which allows students to broaden their knowledge and understand a range of specialised topics whilst immersing themselves in British culture. This is a great opportunity to study and explore English in an excitingly unusual way.

The afternoon is divided into specialised modules. One of the most rewarding modules of the programme for students is Charity. In three weeks they learn about the importance of British and local charities and then create a fundraising event for a charity of their choice.

Starting in September with the option of either 3 or 5 months of study, the course consists of a variety of modules such as Art of Beauty and Theory of Knowledge. This is a great opportunity to study English in a very different, yet highly motivating way. Over the many years this well-established programme

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

We consider your accommodation to be a very important part of your stay and we will make every effort to ensure that you are happy and comfortable throughout your time in Oxford.

Your Host Family

Most CIE students stay in host family accommodation. This provides you with the opportunity to share the daily life of a British family. All our families are British and speak English in the home and will help you practise your English outside of the classroom.



During your stay

You will have breakfast and dinner with the host family during the week and at the weekend all meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) will be provided.

Students of the same nationality will not be placed in the same host family unless you request to stay with a friend.

As CIE is situated in the centre of Oxford, an excellent bus service is available to and from the homes of all our host families.

CIE's accommodation officer inspects the homes of all host families regularly to ensure that they meet our standards as well as those of the British Council.



Our families

The United Kingdom is a multicultural nation with a diverse population, and our host families represent a variety

of ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Our families mirror the United Kingdom as a whole and the various kinds of families that are found here. Some of our host families have two parents, and some are single-parent families. Some families have children living in the home, and others have no children. Residential accommodation (Summer only)

Residential accommodation at Wychwood School for students 10 to 17y.o. provides a happy, social environment where everyone is cared for.

Our rules establish routines which ensure the students' safety and the security of the buildings at all times. In each boarding house there is always an adult member of resident staff on duty 24 hours, 7 days a week. Residential staff have an important part to play to ensure everyone is looked after and included, especially those who are younger or new to the experience of living away from home. Great care is taken by the kitchen staff to provide an excellent variety of good, healthy, and wholesome food.

1 PRIVATE STUDY

After lessons, you are free to study on your own. CIE's Bocardo House is a 5-minute walk from the Oxford City library, which is open six days a week and offers free internet access as well as many other services for students. If you are in Oxford for 3 months or more, CIE can help you sign up for a library card, so you can borrow books and materials from the library. At CIE we have computers with internet which you can use any time

outside of lesson time.We also have a small library with

books and texts written in English. You are welcome to borrow these books while you are a student at CIE by writing your name in the 'signing out' book.

2 SIGHTSEEING

In Oxford there are shops for all different types of fashion; high-street stores, boutiques, delicatessens, craft shops and even antiques stalls. You can visit the market from Wednesday to Saturday. This is a favourite of our students and is only a 2 minute walk from CIE! At the weekend you can visit Bicester Village, just a 25 minute bus ride from us where you can find many famous fashion brands. If you want to stay within the city centre, you will find lots of shopping to do in Cornmarket Street, the Westgate Centre, or the lovely Covered Market.

5 AREA TRANSPORT

The Oxford Bus Company offers local buses, and also regular buses to London, home to some of the world's greatest shopping and dining! The convenient Oxford rail station is in the centre of town, near Oxford University's Said Business School.

Getting to and from London is very easy, as there are direct fast trains very regularly, which take approximately 1 hour and numerous coaches running every 5-10 minutes, which take around 1 hour and 30 minutes.


Stagecoach buses depart every half-hour to take you to fantastic brand-name outlet shopping at nearby Bicester Village.
